Idaho has seen a 22% drop in practicing OB-GYNs since 2022, resulting in increased pressure on remaining maternal health care services statewide. In response, the president-elect of the Idaho Medical Association, Dr. Megan Kasper, is stepping up efforts to respond to this demand, including opening a new clinic in Nampa, to address the gap and improve access for expecting families. 

#### **Idaho Home Visiting Program**

Idaho Home Visiting Program: Supporting Families Where They Are

The Idaho Home Visiting Program (IHVP) is a valuable, underutilized resource that supports families with young children. This free, voluntary service pairs trained home visitors with pregnant women and caregivers of children from birth to age 5. Visits occur in the home or another convenient location and focus on building a trusting, long-term relationship and individualized support.

Home visitors work collaboratively with families to:

- Promote positive parenting practices
- Conduct developmental screenings for infants and young children
- Connect families to local services and community resources
- Address common challenges related to early childhood and parenting

IHVP funds two evidence-based models: Parents as Teachers (PAT), available statewide, and Nurse-Family Partnership (NFP), offered in the Treasure Valley and Panhandle Health Districts. Families must meet eligibility criteria, but generally young or first-time parents, families with low-incomes, and those facing additional stressors such as involvement with child welfare, substance use, or developmental concerns are likely to be eligible.

Story from a Parents As Teachers Home Visitor:

"I have a family I've been serving for about 15 months. When they enrolled in the program, mom had just left an abusive relationship, and she had serious behavioral concerns about her almost 4-year-old. The first ASQ-SE [Ages and Stages Questionnaire -- Social-Emotional] we completed together returned a score that was in the 90th percentile [of risk] and validated mom's concerns. In the time I've been serving this family, they've been able to find stable housing and have been able to find multiple supports for each member of the family, including mental health counseling for each member, and in home behavioral support 1-2 times a week. We recently completed a new social emotional screening on the child, and Mom was excited to see his score is now in the 'no or low risk' range. While the child still has behavioral concerns, his mom feels a lot of hope and optimism about their future."
